BACKGROUND

The Vermont Statehood Bicentennial Commission was created by Act 252 (1986) "to commemorate properly the 200th anniversary of the founding of Vermont" as the 14th state, (1791-1991). William Schubart served as chairman of the Commission from 1986-1990, and William Gray was chairman from 1990-1992. The Directors of the Commission were Freddie Levin (1987) and Carolyn Crowley Meub (1988-1992). The first meeting of the Commissioners was in October 1986, the final meeting was in December 1991, and all Commission business ceased on June 30, 1992.

The Commission and its staff organized, supported and endorsed projects and programs that celebrated Vermont's statehood bicentennial, as well as the 200th anniversary of the United States Constitution (1987) and the Bill of Rights (1991). The projects and programs are far too numerous to name, but include the Ethan Allen reading program, the dramatic monologue on the adoption of the U.S. Constitution ("Vote No"), the Bicentennial Play ("109 Hats to Bennington"), the secession debates, State Capitols program, Statehood Day (March 4th, 1991), the Bicentennial Bash (August 17, 1991), and the Carl Rowan Bill of Rights Program (January 1992). The Commission staff worked with schools in celebrating the bicentennial and many schools were officially designated as Bicentennial Schools. There was a constant dialogue between the Commission and the towns; the Commission served as a catalyst to many town events, and provided speakers, and fundraising ideas. The Commission also sponsored a series of meetings and workshops on ways to celebrate the bicentennial. Much Commission time and energy was spent on publicity; the newsletter, other publications, public service announcements, and press releases spread the word on bicentennial activities, planted ideas for celebrations, and educated the public on the state's history.

Another function of the Commission was the providing of grants. Grant funds were given to historical societies, museums, musicians, town bicentennial committees, schools, libraries, and other organizations and individuals. A very important activity of the Commission was fundraising, to provide for the grants and various sponsored activities. This activity greatly increased in importance when the Commission's FY'91 budget was decreased from \$274,000. to \$100,000. This budget cut resulted in the resignation of chairman William Schubart, and a scurry for funds.

Act 137 (1990) authorized the Bicentennial Commission to work with the Dept. of Motor Vehicles to produce commemorative license plates to raise money for the bicentennial. Funds were also raised through the logo licensing program, contributions from various businesses, and the bicentennial bottle drive.

SCOPE AND CONTENT

The records of the Vermont Statehood Bicentennial Commission give a behind the scenes look at how the Commission functioned, from its inception in 1986 to its dissolution in June, 1992. They reveal where the ideas originated, how events were organized, how the Commission raised money and publicized events, and how the Commission interacted with the towns, schools, businesses, dignitaries, governors and grant seekers. The records document Bicentennial activities throughout Vermont.

The records are divided into fifteen series: Commission Minutes/Committee Records, Correspondence, Projects/Programs, Endorsed Projects, Bicentennial Schools, Bicentennial Towns, Grants, Fundraising, Publicity, Meetings/Workshops, Administrative Records, Videotapes & Audiotapes, Photographs, Postage Stamps/Posters/Brochures, and Artifacts. Types of material include memos, correspondence, magazine and newspaper clippings, videotapes, audiotapes, photographs, postage stamps, posters, brochures, artifacts, press releases, contracts, speeches, newsletters, and reports. All of the records are on microfilm except for the videotapes & audiotapes, photographs, postage stamps, posters, brochures, and artifacts. The Vermont Historical Society also has some bicentennial artifacts and birthday cards created by towns and schools across the state.

This series includes Commission minutes and agenda from October 1986 to December 1991, as well as records relating to Bicentennial Commission Committees. No bicentennial event or issue is untouched in the Commission minutes. The minutes concern the mission and priorities of the Commission, fundraising and financial troubles, publicity, the endorsement of projects, the awarding of grants, use of the Commission's logo, and various bicentennial programs and projects. The Committee records include scattered minutes, notes, agenda, memos and correspondence. Arranged alphabetically.

Covers a wide spectrum of Commission issues and events, ranging from the early scouting for ideas in 1986 to the final days of the Commission in June 1992. Consists of incoming and outgoing correspondence between the Director (and her staff) and the Commissioners, Governors Kunin and Snelling and their staffs, various state agencies, schools, businesses, and citizens across the state and out-of-state. Some of the topics include ideas for and the planning of bicentennial events, fundraising, license plates, publication projects, the U.S. Constitution bicentennial, how state agencies can participate in the bicentennial, logo licensing, Commission goals, the grants program, the homecoming theme, the appropriateness of licensing a bicentennial rifle, or endorsing a bicentennial beer or a bicentennial lottery, the Gannett newspaper and the Coors beer fiascos, and the FY'91 budget cuts. Arranged alphabetically by correspondent, sometimes filed under the name of the corporation (such as museum, school, business). This series also includes some Director's notes on various meetings and phone calls.

The bulk of the projects and programs celebrate the bicentennial of Vermont's statehood, though a few commemorate the bicentennial of the U.S. Constitution and the Bill of Rights.

The records concern the planning and the execution of various events and includes correspondence and memos between the Commission staff, Commissioners, and other organizers of the activities, as well as project evaluation forms, press releases, contracts, newsclippings, and play transcripts. (Many of the files on the State Capitals Program were taken from the files of State Archivist Gregory Sanford, a Commission member. The State Archives sponsored and developed the program.) Arranged alphabetically by project. For related material see Endorsed Projects, the Photograph series, Audiotape and Videotape series, and the Artifacts/Poster series.
